- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen – content on all websites based on whitelabel platform can be viewed under 300% zoom

- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

We've also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

How accessible this website is

We know some parts of this website are not fully accessible:

- Most of our supplementary features of the website across all our products (i.e. chronology, map, data visualisation etc) are disregarded from this statement as majority of these features are created by a legacy third party. An assessment of all such features and their accessibility status are done on collection level basis. The details of this investigation are given in the appendix section of this statement.
- There are few issues across our products that cannot easily be resolved within the existing website platform. Notably, reflow of content, a few contrast issues and few text spacing issues.

Technical information about this website's accessibility

Non accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons. All accessibility issues specified below are sub-sectioned into different sections of the WCAG 2.1 guidelines. These can be found at <https://www.w3.org/TR/WCAG21/#sotd>.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

Perceivable (*Information and user interface components must be presentable to users in ways they can perceive*)

Alternative text missing for few images across the site. For example, some static images in supporting text missing alt text. Similarly, alternative text is missing or inadequate for some icons used across the site. For example, '+' icon in the homepage, high contrast or large text toggle, navigation back and top arrow in contents pages(*), Browse by' filter drop down arrow and 'year' field in the List View page, My Archive saved search icon. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). We plan to add identify all instances where this occurs and add alt texts for all images and icons across the site by Q2 2022.

Audio description for some video content fails against WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.2.5 Audio Description. [Please note: All video documents with audio track have text transcription provided. The majority of videos documents are talking head oral history interviews as referenced in metadata, where audio description is not significant to the content. Silent film have metadata descriptions provided. The Socialism on Film documentary product has scene details listed in metadata].

ARIA-labels are missing for some components across the site. For example, primary navigation icon, '?' icon in the homepage. In addition, we identified some components have duplicate IDs. For example, 'Summary' and 'transcripts' have duplicate IDs for video items, 'Go' button in View all films page (Socialism on Film collection). Both these issues fail WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.3.1 (Info and relationships). We plan to add necessary ARIA-labels for all components across the site via systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026. as well as make all components have unique IDs.

Some checkbox items do not have an accessible name. For example, My Archive page, saved searches. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.3.1 (info and relationships). We plan to create accessible name for all items across the site by via systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

There are few contrast issues across the websites. All websites based on the WhiteLabel platform offers users with visual impairment an option to view content in high contrast mode. However, under high contrast mode some elements in a webpage are lost. For example, Login and register My Archive links. In addition, even in high contrast mode, some elements have insufficient contrast ratio. For example, 'summary' and 'transcripts' tab in video items (Socialism on Film collection). These issues fail WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.3 (Contrast minimum). We plan to fix the former most critical issue by Q2 2023 and we plan to fix the latter issue via systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Across all the sites, content does not reflow. This fails against WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.10 (Reflow). We plan to fix this through systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Some items became visually distorted when text spacing adjustments are implemented as specified by the guideline. For example, components in the main navigation bar, transcripts section in video items (Socialism on Film collection). This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.12 (Text Spacing). We plan to fix this through systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Operable (User interface components and navigation must be operable)

Some components across the site cannot be focused on or used via a keyboard across the site. For example, '+' icon in the homepage, controls in the image viewer, 'Keywords anywhere' and 'And' field in the advanced search page, items in the List view page such as 'date from', 'month', 'year' field, document type drop down. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 2.1.1 (Keyboard). We plan to fix this by Q2 2023.

Some webpages are missing page titles. For example, introduction landing page. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 2.4.2 (Page Titled). We plan to fix this by Q2 2023.

Focus order changed when modals are used across some parts of the site. For example, modal in My Archive. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 2.4.3 (Focus Order). We plan to fix through systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Citation links used across the site does not have link text. For example, in Essay pages. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 2.4.4 (Link Purpose). through systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Some pages have headings that are not adequately marked up as headings via <h> tags. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criteria 1.3.1(info and relationships) as well as WCAG 2.1 success criteria 2.4.6 (headings and labels). We plan to fix this by Q2 2023.

Webpages are missing one main landmark. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 2.4.6 (Headings and Labels). We plan to fix this by Q2 2023.

Understandable (Information and the operation of user interface must be understandable)

Required fields are not semantically defined as being required. For example, in My Archive registration/edit page the * char was detected in the label, indicating a required field, but the field is not/ semantically defined as being required. In addition, error suggestion is not given in an understandable and appropriate manner for disabled users. For example, in the My Archive registration page, error suggestion is given at the top of the page as a list. This will cause problems for users with magnified view. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 3.3.1 (Error Identification). We plan to fix the former issue by Q2 2023 and the latter issue by Q2 2023.

Robust (Content must be robust enough that it can be interpreted by a wide variety of user agents, including assistive technologies)

Iframes in the site are missing titles. For example, iframes in the introduction page. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 4.1.2 (Name Role Value). We plan to fix through systematic product migration from 2022 through 2026.

Disproportionate burden

AM has been publishing digital resources since 2001. Our platforms for delivering that content have been under review and updated regularly, but some elements of legacy platforms and features developed with third parties, for example content reflow, require refactoring work that is disproportionate to the effort in building a new improved platform. Therefore, these features will be revisited/ amended and any outstanding accessibility issues will be tackled as part of our migration to a new platform. How we tested this website

This website was last tested on 09/12/2019. The test was carried out by in-house QA Analyst.

East India Company was the collection chosen as the base means of the audit. In order to get a full coverage of all the features in all white label collections, documents list, video contents and search directories in Socialism on Film collection is also included in the audit as well as 360 image viewer in the African American Communities collection.
